Principal's Letter

Dear Parents and Carers

This has been an eventful couple of weeks... And it's a bumper bulletin!

The data breach at WisePay (now Opayo) seems to have affected very few of our parents, but you are strongly advised to follow the instructions to secure your financial arrangements, as set out in the letters sent to you. This situation was entirely beyond our control but I'm sorry for the inconvenience this has undoubtedly caused.

Covid Positive Case — We dealt with the news that one of our pupils had received a positive test result immediately upon receiving this information on Monday evening. The full procedures we followed are set out in a document on the website, on this link: <https://www.cambournevc.org/COVID-19/procedures>

Following all Public Health guidance, contacts of the affected pupil were swiftly identified and asked not to attend school on Tuesday. Due to our strict 'bubble' arrangements, only 26 pupils are now in self-isolation. Attached to this bulletin is a set of NHS instructions on what to do if a member of your household has symptoms of coronavirus. Every pupil is being given a paper copy of this document; please keep this for your reference at home.

Lost Property — We have a vast quantity of lost property, including many expensive items, much of it unclaimed since before the summer. A last opportunity to collect this is offered on Monday 26 October—the Monday of half term. Please see the list of timings later in this bulletin. Please do send your child if you have lost any items; parents are welcome to attend too. Items still left unclaimed after this will have to be disposed of. **We try to return all named items of lost property** — please help us to do this by writing your child's name in ink, in their clothes, bags etc.

School Uniform — Thank you for all your support with this. Please see later bulletin items, and note that nose studs are not allowed for health and safety reasons.


HISTORIC VIRTUAL LECTURE:

Y7 ARCHAEOLOGY OPPORTUNITY:

Museum of Classical Archaeology Outreach session

Y9 NATIONAL ARCHIVES SESSIONS:

All current Y9 students will be taking part in a live videoconference with the National Archives in London. Students will explore this question: *How typical was Albert Edwin Rippington's experience of war?*

'...if you ever meet a chap that says he wants to go back call him a liar'.

These are words penned by Albert Edwin Rippington, an employee of the Audit Office for the Great Western Railway. Albert, along with many of his colleagues, had enlisted to fight in the First World War. He was wounded in action and wrote about his experiences from his hospital bed back in England. Albert was clearly deeply affected by his time in the trenches, but how typical was his experience?

Exploring a range of letters written by soldiers who enlisted from the Great Western Railway to fight, students will investigate these men's experiences of war; the conditions in the trenches and in reserve, and the impact that these experiences had on their morale and health of these men.

These sessions will be free of charge and will take place in allocated History lessons throughout the next half term. The session will complement Y9s study of the causes of the First World War. Please contact Miss Angell (Head of History) if you have any questions.

Y11 AFTER SCHOOL REVISION SESSIONS:

REPORTING YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL:

Reporting an absence.



If you need to report that your child is going to be absent from school, please email thecollege@cambournevc.org by 9am each morning of absence.

Please state your child's full name, their tutor group and the reason for their absence. **Just reporting your child is 'unwell' will not be accepted.**

Where possible we would advise that medical appointments are made out of school time, but understand that this is not always possible, but pupils should be out of school for the minimum amount of time necessary.

Missing registration for a medical or dental appointment is counted as an authorised absence and advance notice is required for authorising these absences.

Where possible, please provide the attendance office with a copy of the appointment letter/card.

Any pupil leaving the school site for an appointment must sign out at Reception and sign in on return.

FACIAL PIERCINGS:

A very small number of pupils are wearing nose studs to school and I wish to reiterate the school policy on this.

Last year, after listening to pupil requests about school uniform rules, we relaxed our approach a little to allow a small amount of discreet jewellery to be worn, and also allowed coloured nail varnish. This change does not include allowing facial piercings.

Our uniform policy states:

A minimal amount of discreet jewellery which is inoffensive and cannot cause a hazard, may be worn. Nose studs and other facial piercings are not allowed. All jewellery and piercings must be completely removed for PE.

Health and Safety considerations are paramount in this decision, as in all areas of school policy, and override any other factor. All jewellery needs to be removed for PE lessons in order to minimise any risk to pupils. Facial piercings are often found too difficult to remove in school and are not allowed.

As with pierced ears, parents are asked that facial piercings are only done at the start of the long summer holiday so that the item can be safely removed by the time school restarts. Any pupils unable to remove piercings will be asked to cover them with a plaster in school time and they will not be able to participate fully in PE lessons. Once piercings are healed, it is expected that pupils will remove the stud/item for school; refusal to comply with this request will be sanctioned in the same way as any other uniform infringement and will usually involve loss of social time.

Thank you for your support with this measure; we know how much effort parents make to support the high standards of uniform we're able to maintain, and this is very much appreciated.

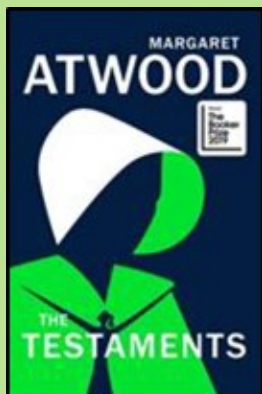

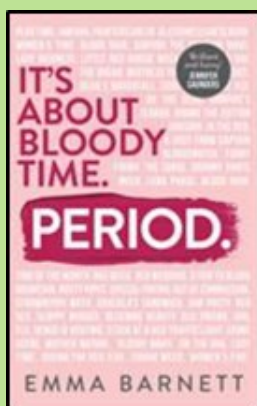


The Testaments by Margaret Atwood
