Principal's Letter

We end this half-term with some exciting news:

Sixth Form Consultation

The Local Authority is supporting plans for us to open a sixth form on the Cambourne Village College site, and you will be invited to take part in a virtual consultation event in November. Along with the development of a full sixth form centre, further expansion of the 11-16 school will be needed to serve the new community of Cambourne West. It is hoped that both developments will be ready to open in September 2023; much more information will follow during the consultation. We are delighted to receive such a strong vote of confidence from the Local Authority and at the prospect of becoming an 11-18 school.

Homework Support Detentions are now running for separate year groups on different afternoons after school. This is a slimmed-down version of our normal system due to the need to separate pupils but is still a reminder to pupils of the need to do their homework on time and to a high standard. All homework is set via Show My Homework – if you have not yet downloaded the app to let you see the homework set for your child, you can do so by following the instructions in the 'Mobile Apps' help section on the Satchel website: https://help.satchelone.com/en/collections/1695420-parents

Travel to School

As clocks go back tomorrow and the darker nights set in, please ensure that your children have reflective clothing and lights if they cycle to school. Please also try to persuade your children to wear waterproof coats when it's raining – our pupils seem very resistant to this!

Covid-19

Over the past half-term, we have dealt with three confirmed cases of coronavirus among our pupils, working closely with the Local Authority's Public Health team. Due to our strong Covid Compliancy measures, only those who have had direct contact with the positive case have had to isolate, and it is a relief that we have so far avoided having to close year groups. Please read the updates later in the bulletin which explain further measures for next half term after a review of our current arrangements.

Curriculum

This has been a strenuous half term and staff have worked incredibly hard, under difficult conditions, to assess the work pupils completed over the summer and to adjust the curriculum to accommodate this. Some pupils, starting with Year 11, will be receiving invitations to special 'Catch-Up' sessions after school over the next weeks, and this programme will roll out as the year progresses.

Covid-19 Update and New Arrangements

CORONAVIRUS SYMPTOMS



Please continue to refer to the attached NHS guidance.

If anyone in your household has any of the symptoms of coronavirus, they must get a test and EVERYONE in your household must self-isolate until the results are received.

It is essential that you do not send your children to school if someone at home is symptomatic.

Please continue to inform school over the break if anyone in your household has new symptoms of coronavirus or any updates on their condition by emailing thecollege@Cambournevc.org with the subject line **Covid Update**. This is so that we can assist with contact tracing.

MASKS COMPULSORY IN CORRIDORS FROM 02 NOVEMBER

Pupils will now be required to wear masks when moving around inside school, as well as observing social distancing whenever possible.

This is not strictly necessary for Covid Compliancy due to the strong separation of year group 'bubbles'. However, it may help to reduced transmission within year groups as pupils move through corridors and queue for the cafeteria.

Please ensure that your children bring a mask to school and have a plastic bag to store it. Please contact your child's Year Team if you would like assistance in providing a mask, or if there is a reason your child cannot wear a mask – of course this will be respected.

Those pupils who wish to wear a mask in lesson time may do so.

Masks must not be worn during PE lessons since they inhibit breathing during exertion; all PE venues are highly ventilated or outside.

If your child displays unrelated symptoms, such as a runny nose or sore throat, you should act in the same way as you would have done before the pandemic. This may involve sending your child to school or keeping them at home, depending on the nature and severity of symptoms. Seek medical advice via your GP or 111 as you normally would. If your child has sickness or diarrhoea they should not return to school until 48 hours after the last bout of this.

REPORTING YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

If you need to report that your child is going to be absent from school, please email thecollege@cambournevc.org by 9am each morning of absence.

Please state your child's full name, their tutor group and the reason for their absence. **Just reporting your child is 'unwell' will not be accepted.**

Where possible we would advise that medical appointments are made out of school time, but understand that this is not always possible, but pupils should be out of school for the minimum amount of time necessary.

Missing registration for a medical or dental appointment is counted as an authorised absence and advance notice is required for authorising these absences.

Where possible, please provide the attendance office with a copy of the appointment letter/card.

Any pupil leaving the school site for an appointment must sign out at Reception and sign in on return.

Medical: please remember that it is the parents/carers' responsibility to make sure that all emergency medication for your child is in school and in date.

HALF TERM LOST PROPERTY COLLECTION: Y8, Y9, Y10 and Y11

We have mountains of lost property! Monday 26th October 2020

This will be located in the main hall, with access from the side of the building.

Please come at your allocated slot (see below). Parents welcome to come with their child.

Please note that due to the current Covid-19 measures in place, pupils/parents/carers will be required to maintain 2 metres distance at all times whilst waiting to come into the hall.

You will be required to wear a mask and pupils their name badge. You will also be required to sign in to adhere to the Track & Trace measures in place.

Pupils are asked to come as per the allocated year group timeslots below. Pupils will not be allowed to attend a different timeslot and will be turned away should they arrive earlier/later than the timings outlined below for their year group.

SCHOOL UNIFORM



We are nearing the close of our first half term and the pupils have made an fantastic start particularly to adjusting to all the various requirements in place for school safety.

We have, however, started to see a slip in school uniform compliance, particularly around appropriate length skirts and the wearing of jeans.

A gentle reminder that pupils who do not meet our expectations about uniform will usually receive a sanction...

ADDITIONAL CLOTHING LAYERS

Heating levels in classrooms are now well controlled. Any pupil who particularly feels the cold should wear an extra layer underneath their polo shirt and pupils may wear their red PE hoodies (with hoods down) over their grey school uniform jumpers if they are still feel chilly. Coats will not be needed inside the building.

FACIAL PIERCINGS

A very small number of pupils are wearing nose studs to school; these are not allowed.

Last year, after listening to pupil requests about school uniform rules, we relaxed our approach a little to allow a small amount of discreet jewellery to be worn, and also allowed coloured nail varnish. This change does not include allowing facial piercings.

Our uniform policy states:

A minimal amount of discreet jewellery which is inoffensive and cannot cause a hazard, may be worn. Nose studs and other facial piercings are not allowed. All jewellery and piercings must be completely removed for PE.

Health and Safety considerations are paramount in this decision, as in all areas of school policy, and override any other factor. All jewellery needs to be removed for PE lessons in order to minimise any risk to pupils. Facial piercings are often found too difficult to remove in school and are not allowed.

As with pierced ears, parents are asked that facial piercings are only done at the start of the long summer holiday so that the item can be safely removed by the time school restarts.

Any pupils unable to remove piercings will be asked to cover them with a plaster in school time and they will not be able to participate fully in PE lessons.

Once piercings are healed, it is expected that pupils will remove the stud/item for school; refusal to comply with this request will be sanctioned in the same way as any other uniform infringement and will usually involve loss of social time.

Thank you for your support with this measure; we know how much effort parents make to support the high standards of uniform we're able to maintain, and this is very much appreciated.

HISTORIC VIRTUAL LECTURE


The Cambourne History Department are thrilled to announce the return of their free public lecture programme.

Y7 ARCHAEOLOGY OPPORTUNITY

Museum of Classical Archaeology Outreach session

Y9 NATIONAL ARCHIVES SESSIONS

All current Y9 students will be taking part in a live videoconference with the National Archives in London. Students will explore this question: *How typical was Albert Edwin Rippington's experience of war?*

"...if you ever meet a chap that says he wants to go back call him a liar".

These are words penned by Albert Edwin Rippington, an employee of the Audit Office for the Great Western Railway. Albert, along with many of his colleagues, had enlisted to fight in the First World War. He was wounded in action and wrote about his experiences from his hospital bed back in England. Albert was clearly deeply affected by his time in the trenches, but how typical was his experience?

Exploring a range of letters written by soldiers who enlisted from the Great Western Railway to fight, students will investigate these men's experiences of war; the conditions in the trenches and in reserve, and the impact that these experiences had on their morale and health of these men.

These sessions will be free of charge and will take place in allocated History lessons throughout the next half term. The session will complement Y9s study of the causes of the First World War. Please contact Miss Angell (Head of History) if you have any questions.


