# **Reporting your Child's Absence from School:**

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school you have a legal requirement to inform the school **on each day of absence**. If you are reporting your child's absence from school today, please can you email <u>cam-absence@cambournevc.org</u> by 8:30am every day of the absence and leave a message clearly stating the reason for absence and the child's full name and tutor group. If you fail to inform the school, we are legally required to make contact with you, to ensure the child's safety. Even if they have been absence on the previous day we cannot assume they are still at home poorly.

# Appointments:

If your child misses registration for a medical or dental appointment, this is counted as an authorised absence. Please give advance notice, ideally 2 school days, by <u>cam-</u> <u>absence@cambournevc.org</u> with the dates and times the pupil is expected to be out of school and preferably with a copy of the appointment card/notification so that the absence can be authorised. As much as possible, pupils should be in school prior to/ after the appointment and out of school for as little time as possible.

Prior notification ensures the Year team and Reception staff are aware of your child arriving late / leaving early and the necessary arrangements can be put in place. If your child needs to leave early for an appointment, they should inform their teacher that they need to be excused early and make their own way down to Reception. The Reception staff will try to help locate children for appointments, but we do not always have someone available to do a collection from lessons.

# Planned Absence Request:

If you plan to take your child out of school for any other reason, a **Planned Absence Request Form** must be completed and returned to the school **10 days prior** to the absence for authorisation. Please email any completed forms to <u>cam-absence@cambournevc.org</u> or hand into our reception. The form can be found on our <u>website</u>, or is available from our reception.

Please note that due to Changes to Section 444 of The Education Act 1996 brought into effect in September 2013, the Principal cannot authorise any term time leave unless there are **exceptional circumstances.** 

All pupils leaving early for appointments need to be collected by a parent to sign them out through our main Reception.

### Pupil Photographs

On **<u>Tuesday 19th September</u>**, Pupils will be having their official school photographs, taken by Kittle Photography.

- Year 7s will be having their individual and tutor group photos
- Year 8s will have tutor group photos (as these were missed last autumn)
- Year 11 will have their tutor group photos

If your child has PE on Tuesday, please also ensure that <u>they also have their full school</u> <u>uniform to change into for the photographs.</u>

- If they have PE in the morning—they will want to change into their school uniform later
- If they have PE in the afternoon—they will want to come into school in their uniform and bring their PE kit.

Additional Year 11 individual photographs will be taken in November.

# Flu immunisation for pupils in school years Reception - Year 11

### DEAR PARENT/CARER,

The flu vaccine is being offered at your child's school again this autumn/winter.

To give consent for your child to have the flu vaccine, please click here:

Even if you do not wish for your child to have the vaccine, please complete the online form so that we can record your wishes.

### THE NASAL FLU VACCINE

- Protects your child from the flu.
- Protects your family and friends from the flu (especially those who are elderly, young babies, or those who have serious health conditions).
- / Is painless, quick and effective.
- Is free

### THE IM FLU VACCINE



We also offer the flu vaccine as an injection, which is **gelatinefree**. This *may* also be the vaccine of choice for vegans. Please go to our website where you can find out more about the manufacturing of the flu injection, and then decide if the injection is more suited to your child.

You only need to complete one consent form for each child. If you later change your mind, please call your local team. If your child has this immunisation elsewhere after you have submitted the consent form, you **MUST** inform Vaccination UK rather than the school.

We understand that you may have questions about the vaccine. For more information, please go to our website, where you can find a list of FAQ's, as well as details of our community catch up clinics. We also have some FAQ's enclosed below.

# USEFUL INFO

We endeavour to come to your child's school twice. If they are absent or unable to be vaccinated at school, you will need to attend one of our community clinics for the vaccine. Details of these can be found on our website or you can contact the team above.



PLEASE NOTE the flu vaccine will NOT be available to otherwise healthy children after December 15th at all, and so we urge you to return the consent form as soon as possible in case we are not able to visit your child's schools for a second visit this year.



Your consent will remain in place for the entire flu season. If your child misses a first visit, you do not need to complete a second form.

## **Pupil Flu Vaccinations** - additional information



### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

\*The consent form needs to be signed by a person with parental responsibility which includes:

- Mother: automatic
- Father: if married to the mother either when baby is born or marries subsequently
- Unmarried father: if name appears on birth certificate (since 1/12/03) or legally acquired
  - Others: if parental responsibility is legally acquired
  - · Parental Responsibility Agreement: signed, properly witnessed and sent for registration to Principle Registry or the Family Division (High Court)
  - Residence Order: granted by the Court

Please note that young people under the age of 16 can give or refuse consent if considered

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### Are there any side effects of the vaccine?

Possible side effects are: decreased appetite, headache, a runny or blocked nose, and sometimes a raised temperature. These are common, but they pass quickly and can be treated with paracetamol or ibuprofen if you feel your child needs it.

### Are there any children who shouldn't have the nasal vaccine?

You should let us know if your child has any of the following:

- A very severe allergy to eggs, egg proteins, gentamicin or gelatine - it is important for us to know if your child has been admitted to hospital with a condition called anaphylaxis, triggered by these things.
- Are currently wheezy or have been wheezy in the past 72 hours with asthma. There is an alternative flu vaccine that we can talk to you about to ensure that your child is protected as soon as possible.
- Have a condition that severely weakens their immune system.

Also, children who have been vaccinated should avoid close contact with people with very severely weakened immune systems for around two weeks following vaccination (By severely weakened, we generally mean people who are isolating, such as those who have received some types of chemotherapy or people who have had a bone marrow transplant, for example). This is because there's an extremely remote chance that the vaccine virus may be passed to them.

Contact with other healthy children or adults does not need to be limited after having the vaccine.

### We do not eat pork products. Can my child have a different flu vaccine?

Yes. There is a flu vaccine available, in the form of an injection.

The nasal flu vaccine is the best vaccine for children and young people under 18 years of age as it is more effective at stopping the spread of flu and it is painless, but it does have a highly processed form of gelatine (porcine gelatine), which is used in a range of many essential medicines. The gelatine helps to keep the vaccine viruses stable so that the vaccine provides the best protection against flu.

If your faith or beliefs mean you would prefer a vaccine that has no pork (porcine gelatine) in it, please complete the consent for the flu injection only. You do not need to complete a form for both.

If your child is vegan, please note that the flu injection is a cell based vaccine. For more information, please see our FAQs page on our website:

# **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

We believe that wearing uniform helps to create a sense of identity and community in school. Our uniform is smart, practical and comfortable and we expect pupils to wear it with pride when at school, on journeys between home and school, and especially when representing the school on visits and fixtures.

Pupils who do not meet our expectations about uniform will be asked to change and non-compliance will usually be sanctioned.

<u>Shirts:</u> Branded College blue polo shirt (grey for Prefects). Any garment worn under the polo shirt must not be visible whether the shirt is worn buttoned or unbuttoned.

<u>Sweatshirts</u>: Branded grey College sweatshirt (Black for Year 11). The College sweatshirt must always be worn as the next layer over the polo shirt, when another layer is required.

**Trousers:** Branded College trousers – should finish below the ankle. They must be worn with plain socks which can be either grey, black or white.

**Skirts:** Branded skirt – should finish at the knee. Skirts are worn with unpatterned black or neutral tights, *or* with plain socks in either grey, black or white.

**Shorts:** Branded shorts may be worn. They must be worn with plain socks in either grey, black or white.

**Shoes:** Completely black leather or leather-style shoes that can be polished, with a flat sole. No contrasting branding, sandals, pumps, canvas/fabric style shoes, or boots.

<u>Jewellery</u>: The only jewellery permitted is one small, plain stud in each pierced ear. Nose studs and other facial piercings (including temporary blank/neutral retainers) are not acceptable. All jewellery and piercings must be completely removed for PE. Earrings cannot be taped or covered at any time within the school. Please ensure that new piercing is only done at the beginning of the summer holiday and not done within the academic year.

Hairstyles: Extreme haircuts and colours as judged by the College are not allowed.

<u>Make-up:</u> Natural-looking make-up may be worn. Long fingernails are not acceptable for safety reasons. Fingernails should not be visible above the fingers when the hand is viewed from the palm.

<u>**Outside wear:**</u> When travelling to and from school and when outside the school building, pupils are allowed to wear all items of outdoor clothing, including coats, jackets, hoodies, scarves, gloves and hats. None of these should have inappropriate slogans or logos. These should be removed before entering the building.

# PE UNIFORM

PE Kit Compulsory CamVC branded items

- Red CamVC Sports T-Shirt or Polo T-shirt
- Rec CamVC Sports Hoodie or fleece

### PE Kit Compulsory CamVC non-branded items

Plain black shorts (not cycling shorts nor skin-tight shorts) and/or plain black skort OR plain black tracksuit trousers (our field is very windy) OR CamVC Black Leggings OR all three \*

- **Indoor Trainers** (not school shoes nor pumps such as Vans, Converse, Air Force 1s)
- **Outdoor astro trainers** (for football, rugby and hockey on the 3G pitch)
- Long black hockey/football socks or an alternative

### Optional PE kit

- Cam VC Black Leggings
- A plain black, red or white base layer top
- Red Cam VC Fleece
- Rec Cam VC Rugby Top

Shin pads for football and hockey are strongly recommended for both lessons & fixtures.

**Gum Shields** for rugby and hockey are strongly recommended for both lessons & fix-tures.

**Outdoor "Astro-style" studs:** These are training shoes that have soles with a higherthan-normal raised moulded pattern, for use on artificial grass surfaces. Boots need to have either dimpled soles, plastic studs or moulded blades; flat soled trainers, metal capped or metal studs are not permitted for health and safety reasons and for maintenance of the artificial pitch surface.

**CamVC Black Leggings:** The only black leggings that will be allowed in PE lessons will be CamVC black leggings purchased from the School PE Kit These have a clear CamVC PE logo down the back calf to be easily identifiable.

\*Non-CamVC black leggings can be worn but must be worn under a pair of regulation black sports shorts

If your child has **lost an item of uniform**, please ask them to check with their **Year team office** in the first instance, or please **email <u>thecollege@cambournevc.org</u>** so that we can arrange for your child to check our unnamed items.

If your child needs a coat/jacket and would like to look through our unnamed items to find something suitable for them, please ask them to go to their Year team office or email the College.

We would expect that it might take pupils between 1 - 2 weeks to source some earphones / headphones, but after that it would be useful if they were ready to use the in lessons. If for any reason it is not possible for your child to bring some earphones to the lesson, please email (or ask them to email) their class teacher. In cases of financial constraints we will be able to provide headphones for pupils to borrow, if arranged in advance.






