Reporting your Child's Absence from School:

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school you have a legal requirement to inform the school **on each day of absence**. If you are reporting your child's absence from school today, please can you email cam-absence@cambournevc.org by **8:30am every day of the absence** and leave a message clearly stating the reason for absence and the child's full name and tutor group. If you fail to inform the school, we are legally required to make contact with you, to ensure the child's safety. Even if they have been absence on the previous day we cannot assume they are still at home poorly.

Appointments:

If your child misses registration for a medical or dental appointment, this is counted as an authorised absence. Please give advance notice, ideally 2 school days, by cam-absence@cambournevc.org with the dates and times the pupil is expected to be out of school and preferably with a copy of the appointment card/notification so that the absence can be authorised. As much as possible, pupils should be in school prior to/ after the appointment and out of school for as little time as possible.

Prior notification ensures the Year team and Reception staff are aware of your child arriving late / leaving early and the necessary arrangements can be put in place. If your child needs to leave early for an appointment, they should inform their teacher that they need to be excused early and make their own way down to Reception. The Reception staff will try to help locate children for appointments, but we do not always have someone available to do a collection from lessons.

Planned Absence Request:

If you plan to take your child out of school for any other reason, a **Planned Absence Request Form** must be completed and returned to the school **10 days prior** to the absence for authorisation. Please email any completed forms to cam-absence@cambournevc.org or hand into our reception. The form can be found on our [website](#), or is available from our reception.

Please note that due to Changes to Section 444 of The Education Act 1996 brought into effect in September 2013, the Principal cannot authorise any term time leave unless there are **exceptional circumstances**.

All pupils leaving early for appointments need to be collected by a parent to sign them out through our main Reception.

Whole School Culture Day:

On Friday 5th July, Cambourne Village College will be celebrating all our wonderful and diverse cultures in a whole school Culture Day. During the day, there will be stands and displays for students to learn about some of the various cultures we have represented in our community and, at the end of the day, there will be a Culture Day Garden Party. Lessons will run as normal during this day.

This day will be a **cultural dress day**. If there is a particular and specific dress style for your culture, you are encouraged to come and represent your culture in a visual way. We ask that all students are respectful during this day and wear appropriate clothing; football shirts are acceptable but there should be no political statements, offensive slogans or inappropriately exposing, tight or overly short clothes. All tops should end below the rib cage.

There will be a contribution of £1 for this day, payable on ParentPay. This money will all be donated to Save the Children.



Summer Weather: The summer weather seems to have arrived (a little late, and we may be being a bit over-optimistic about its longevity!).

As a reminder, please ensure that your children are prepared for the warmer days, including:

- Ensuring they always carry a water bottle and refill it at break and lunchtime
- Ensuring they take any antihistamines before leaving home in the morning
- Ensuring they apply sun protection before going out in the sunshine at PE, break and lunchtime

The school cannot administer antihistamines (or any other medication) to your child without your prior written consent. If you want the school to hold antihistamines for your child we are happy to do so, but you will need to complete the appropriate form from our [website](#) and drop it into Reception with the medication.



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Pupils with medications in School:

Please can Year 11 parents ensure that they arrange the collection of their child's medication that the school holds for them, on or after Thursday 20th June.

We have some controlled medications locked in the first aid room (which will need to be collected by an adult) and some emergency boxes in reception (as well as the normal paracetamol etc) but we can give that medication to the pupils if they come and ask for it.

Any medications not collected by the 18th July will be responsibly disposed of.

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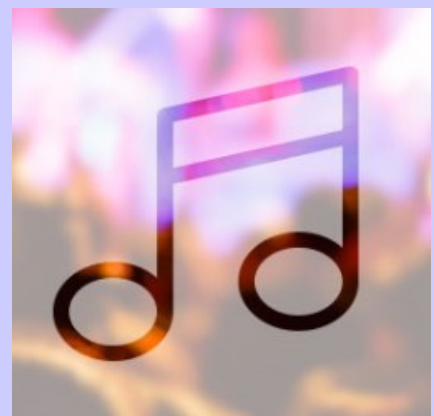

Please refer to the poster below for specific details we have highlighted and kindly support us in reminding your children about our uniform expectations.

| Sweatshirts: | Branded grey College sweatshirt (Optional Black sweatshirt for Year 11). | No other sweatshirts, jacket or hooded top is permitted. |
| Polo Shirts: | Branded College blue polo shirt. (Grey or purple for Prefects). | No other shirt is permitted. |
| Trousers: | Plain black, formal, tailored, loose fitting, school trousers. These should sit on top of the shoe (see examples). | No skin-tight/stretchy/slim fit trousers, leggings or 'jeans' type trousers. |
| Skirts: | Plain black school style skirt touching the knee or longer. <u>Note:</u> Skirts should be loose enough to remain at the knee. | No short, skin-tight, or stretchy skirts are allowed. |
| Shorts | Plain black knee length shorts of a formal style (see examples). | No sport shorts or other style or colour permitted |
| Socks / Tights | Plain black, grey, or white. | No other style or colour permitted |
| Shoes: | Completely black leather or leather-style sensible shoes with a flat sole. | No contrasting branding, trainers, sandals, pumps, canvas/fabric style shoes, high heels, or boots. |
| Jewellery: | One watch, one pair of small stud earrings, one ring on hand. No facial piercings. | No other visible jewellery is permitted. All jewellery and piercings must be completely removed for PE/Dance. |
| Hairstyles: | Hair colour should be natural. Hair accessories should be functional and discreet. | Extreme hair colours or hairstyles as judged by the College are not allowed. No hats or bandanas allowed. |
| Make Up: | Natural-looking make-up may be worn. Nail varnish is permitted. | False/acrylic nails. |
| Outside wear: | On their journey into school and in outside social spaces, pupils are allowed to wear all items of outdoor clothing, including coats, jackets, hoodies, scarves, gloves, and hats. | No outside wear inside the building Outdoor wear should not have any inappropriate slogans or logos |
| Earphones / Mobile phones | Students are allowed to bring these to school and will switch these off and place in schoolbag upon arrival to school. | No earphones / mobile phones to be visible on school site. These will be confiscated by staff if seen. |

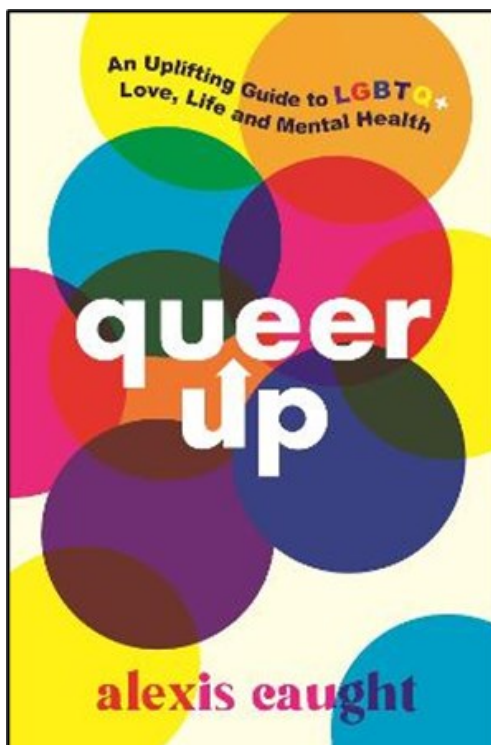


Proud of Me

A beautifully written story about self-acceptance and the importance of opening up to those closest to you. Becky and Josh are almost-twins, with two mums and the same anonymous donor dad. Josh can't wait until he's eighteen, the legal age when he can finally contact his father, and he'll do anything to find out more - even if it involves lying. Becky can't stop thinking about her new friend, Carli. Could her feelings for Carli be a sign of something more? Becky and Josh both want their parents to be proud of them... but right now, they're struggling to even accept themselves. Told through the alternating perspectives of Becky and Josh, Proud of Me is an important story of belonging, trying to discover more about yourself and your identity, whether that's where you came from or your sexuality.

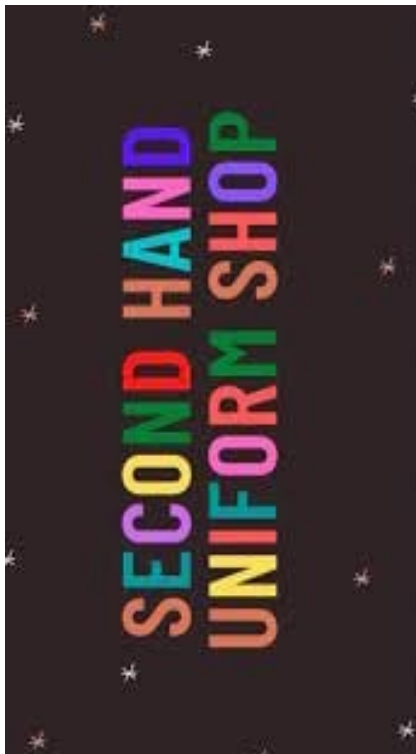

Mental Health Text Line

A new local mental health free text messaging support service has launched across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. **HEAR 85258** is being funded by NHS Cambridgeshire & Peterborough, in partnership with the national service SHOUT.

The free to use text service provides real-time support to people who are struggling with their mental health across the county.

When texting the word HEAR to 85258, the person will be connected to a trained volunteer who will offer them calm in a time or place of crisis. During the confidential and anonymous conversation, the texter will be supported while working on a plan of action and signposted to local and national mental health services.

Texting HEAR to 85258 is free, discreet and runs 24/7. It won't appear on a mobile bill and requires no app, data, password, or registration. It is available for anyone who lives, works or studies in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

Safeguarding

At Cambourne Village College we work hard to make sure that we build up positive relationships with the pupils in our care and we hope that we can support families in safeguarding your children.

What is safeguarding?

- Protecting children
- Preventing harm to a child

This includes a variety of different aspects. We are here to help your child make good choices but also support them if they make a mistake.

We work with individual students, their families and external agencies.

What do we do at CamVC to safeguard your child?

- **Staff are vigilant** – staff are very good at noticing small changes and listening to the concerns of those in our care. Tutors are well placed in this process, however all staff play an active role in this.
- **Designated Team** – we have a specific team of people working each day to address concerns raised by staff, pupils, parents and external agencies. This team works to make sure concerns are addressed and the appropriate support is advised
- **Pupil Voice** - we encourage pupils to speak to us or raise their concerns via the 'Report a Concern' button on their iPad

COMBINED MINDS APP

Combined Minds is an app for parents and carers developed for teenage mental health charity Stem4 by Clinical Psychologists. The app aims to help families and friends support young people with their mental health.

Combined Minds use a 'strength based approach' which focuses on the positive attributes of the person and builds on resourcefulness and resilience. The app helps families to find ways to provide the right environment to help individuals they support affect their own change.

The app includes providing further information on certain needs such as anxiety and digital addiction as well as offering ways of accessing further help and useful suggestions of 'things you can do in the moment' to help support the young person.
